Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

- US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) program. Federal monies administered by local officials. Possibilities of money being allocated for historic preservation if linked to overall community development and revitalization. Federal Historic Preservation Tax Credit Program

- Tax incentive program for the rehabilitation of nationally registered, income producing, historic buildings. Administered by the Architectural Review and

Incentives Unit, State Office of Historic Preservation. Can also provide tax incentives for providing charitable contributions of partial interests in historic property (chiefly easements), and for the acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of low-income housing.

Investment Credit for Low-Income Housing

- Investment tax credit for acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of low-income housing. Aimed at encouraging owners to develop and provide low-incoming housing to a community. Can be used alone or concurrently with the Federal Historic Preservation Tax Incentive.

<u>TEA-21: The Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century, United States Department of</u> <u>Transportation</u>

Concept is to enhance, maintain, and preserve the existing transportation network while more creatively and sensitively integrating it into the surrounding communities. Several eligibility requirements emphasize historic properties.

- Authorizes cities, counties, and redevelopment agencies to issue tax-exempt revenue bonds to finance the rehabilitation of significant historic buildings.
