Topic: Summary of Community Questionnaire Results			

In 2021, the City of Dinuba began the process of a Focused General Plan Update to the City's Land Use and Circulation Elements of the General Plan. The main elements of the ongoing Focused General Plan Update include:

- Provide new residential areas around the area of the proposed high school at the corner of Kamm and Alta Avenues.
- Look at policies that encourage more mixed-uses (commercial and residential) in the downtown core and other commercial areas of the community.
- Pursue recommended zoning changes to allow a combination of residential and commercial areas in the East El Monte Way area.
- Implement safety improvements at key City intersections and improve alternative modes of circulation throughout the City.
- Prepare an Environmental Justice section that includes new goals, policies, and programs that promote equitable environmental health for all communities.

The City is engaging in a broad spectrum of outreach activities to inform the community about the project, invite them to participate, and get input on focus area issues and concerns. These activities include stakeholder interviews, an online community questionnaire, and a future community workshop. This memorandum provides a summary of the community questionnaire and responses.

Community Questionnaire Input Summary

A total of 60 individuals participated in the questionnaire between April 14th, 2022, and November 4th, 2022. The Community Questionnaire provided community members with the opportunity to submit input related to land use updates to Focus Areas and improvements to circulation within Dinuba. Below are some common themes that arose from community input:

- Support for walking trails, parks, sports fields, and playgrounds around the new residential neighborhood proposed near the new high school site.
- Community need for an increase in entry level homes for purchase, apartments and/or condos, and senior housing/assisted living facilities.
- Desire to see more mixed-use developments located in the downtown core area.
- Support for upgrades to downtown building facades.
- Interest in intersection improvements at S. Alta & Road 400, W. El Monte & Road 56 and E. El Monte & Road 92.
- Support to add bike lanes and pedestrian paths near schools, downtown, and residential areas.
- Concern over increased homelessness.
- Desire for more high-paying jobs.

Question I - Purpose and Summary:

The survey's introductory question was aimed at understanding what participants like best about Dinuba. A majority of respondents, 47%, indicated that their favorite quality of Dinuba is the small-town community character, while 25% of respondents favored retaining surrounding agriculture/open space areas.

Question 2 - Purpose and Summary:

Question 2 asked participants about their preference for improvements desired in the new residential areas planned around the new high school site near Alta Avenue and Kamm Avenue. 73% of respondents indicated walking trails as their choice, while 72% selected parks, sports fields, and playgrounds.

Question 3 - Purpose and Summary:

Question 3 asked participants which type of housing they feel is needed most in the City. A vast majority of respondents (87%) indicated entry level homes for purchase are most needed, while 68% indicated apartments and/or condos.

Question 4 - Purpose and Summary:

Question 4 asked participants about where mixed uses would best fit in Dinuba. The vast majority of respondents (63%) indicated that mixed uses would be a best fit in the downtown core area (the vicinity of L Street between Fresno and Tulare Streets) with residential or office uses on upper floors.

Question 5 - Purpose and Summary:

Question 5 asked participants about their preference for other improvements for revitalization and beautification in the downtown area. 65% of respondents indicated upgrades to building facades, while 53% indicated outdoor event space.

• More dining, and maybe a Costco, better play equipment in the park and some type of canopy over the playground

Question 6 - Purpose and Summary:

Question 6 asked participants which intersections beyond Alta Avenue/Nebraska Avenue and Alta Avenue/Kamm Avenue they would like to see improved. 53% of respondents S. Alta & Road 400, while 44% of respondents indicated W El. Monte & Road 56 and E. El Monte & Road 92.

Question 7 - Purpose and Summary:

Question 7 asked participants about their preference for additional bike lanes or pedestrian paths within the City, or both. 53% of respondents indicated they support both new bike lanes and walking paths while 32% indicated support for additional walking trails and sidewalks.

Question 10 - Purpose and Summary:

Question 10 asked participants what they felt are the most important social and environmental issues in Dinuba. The top two most common responses indicated homelessness (45%) and high-earning job availability (38%).

- Ave 426 going to Vista Robles homes is in really bad shape
- I would like to see a few bars around downtown just so downtown be more lively. Also, it will help police be more active in downtown. Weekends will be active with bars because we have a few restaurants nearby, movie theater, bowling alley, etc. With bars in downtown, it can also help the small businesses in downtown.
- Adding stop signs on S. Uruapan and W Tulare St. every time I have to go by there, I'm so close to getting in a car accident, since I can't see cars coming and going on W Tulare St. How about adding other businesses where Jack in the Box is? That side of Dinuba is dead. Only new businesses are towards W El Monte Way and Rd 80. When high school is complete, there is going to be so much traffic to get to that school. It's in a bad location, major cross st. and lots of traffic. Jefferson and Golden Way, no crosswalk for students to cross over, they have to walk to Sierra. Other schools have several crosswalks near schools
- The trees and planters on downtown are nice. Don't remove them. Facades downtown need modernization
- We need a good grocery store. Tired of having to shop out of town for good quality groceries and paying taxes out of town and having to pay for gas to travel for essentials. Our town needs to be more self-sufficient in terms of having adequate grocery stores, and having more to choose from. The homelessness problem behind AM/PM and Ruiz Foods needs to be addressed. The area by KMART needs revamping/beautification to attract more people to that side of town and even out the traffic flow. More car lanes, too much traffic congestion on Alta and El Monte. The downtown area needs beautification too, and we want more city events to bring the community together.
- I would like to add the completion of the park at Viscaya Subdivision. Been told about it since we purchased our home and only the walking trail to the school has been completed. The subdivision has grown quickly, a lot of our families utilize our area for walking, jogging and it would be nice for families to enjoy a park..
- The city needs to look into moving that homeless camp at the park near Walmart. That area does not feel safe. Many of those homeless roam the Walmart parking lot harassing shoppers.
- Princessa Grocery Store parking lot has a lot of potholes. Also, road between Perkos and doctors office by stop light has pot holes
- What's needed: Better road management, more streetlights, more pedestrian crosswalks with lights, extra bike lane on El Monte way going west, youth center that focuses on youth empowerment, more mental health resources and services for adults, substance abuse services and support programs, inclusive spaces (shops, restaurants, centers, events, etc) for LGBTQ+ people, events focused on wellness and community building
- There are many empty lots near commercial areas that can be used for multifunctional purposes, instead of single-family homes. For instance, the lot at the corner of N Alta Ave and Davis Dr. This area can be used for restaurants and other commercial uses. Just don't put a parking lot there.
- Dinuba is a great community for families looking for a place to live, however we need to make it affordable to all
- Look up Boise vs Martin court case! Any publicly owned walking trails and parks can be legally encamped upon by the homeless regardless of proximity to schools or residential neighborhoods. Do not place walking trails near residential neighborhoods!!!
- We desperately need an attractive downtown where people want to come to and upgraded businesses for shopping, dining that included music and cocktails. Don't forget the adults in our community.
- I hate to compare but when you visit Kingsburg and compare it to Dinuba it's like comparing Earth to Mars with all due respect. We need to ask what do we want Dinuba to look and feel like, and then plan accordingly
- We need apartments that are not low built. We have plenty of low-income apartments which is great, but many young college graduates who start their career move away from Dinuba because they

don't qualify for low-income apartments. We lose great citizens to other communities like Reedley and Kingsburg. Let's keep what we breed by making housing available, beautifying downtown with desirable shops, and venues. Thank you for taking our input. This is great. Safety is going to be a big concern. I think a Costco or Target would be nice. A gas station on the southeast side of Dinuba would be nice too.
